## The DKG - Industry Platform and Innovation Driver

In 1926, rubber chemists and engineers in Düsseldorf founded a scientific society: the German Rubber Society. Its goal was to promote the exchange of ideas for the benefit of the entire rubber industry.

Much has changed in the nearly 100 years since its founding. Our core mission, however, has not changed. The DKG offers a platform for experts from research, development and industry that is unique in Germany. They come together in regional groups, working groups and at events, discuss problems and work together to find realistic and usable solutions.

For individuals who are at the beginning of their careers, the DKG organises seminars in collaboration with the German Institute of Rubber Technology. We provide support for young scientists in the form of promotional awards and scholarships. Our Rubber Hall of Fame gives honour to outstanding achievements throughout a persons career.

The DKG is also an innovation driver for the industry as a member of the German Federation of Industrial Research Associations "Otto von Guericke" e. V. (AiF). With have already implemented numerous community research projects whereby funding was received from federal level.

### **Expert2Expert -Exchange on an equal footing**

Natural rubber becomes robust, flexible, and functional through the interaction with other substances. Molecules connect, bridges are formed, and the structure is altered. This can also be applied to the actors in our industry. Experts from research, technology, and business bring their respective expertise and experience. Theory and practice come together. Different perspectives and approaches enable innovative processes.

In the regional groups, personal contact is possible without extensive travel. Issues of relevance to the region can also be discussed there. Each regional group organises two conferences per year.

Our working groups and networks are dedicated to specific areas of expertise, interests or stakeholders. Here our members discuss topics such as rubber rheology, mixing technology, university and young talent or the advancement of women.

In addition to our annual conference, we organise the German Rubber Conference (DKT) in Nuremberg every three years with an associated international trade fair. This is where the entire industry family meets.

## **Excellent** achievements

#### Young talent awards

With the DKG award, DKG honours students for outstanding bachelor's and master's theses, as well as voluntary commitment during their studies. The Dissertation Award is awarded annually for an excellent dissertation on a rubber or elastomer topic.

#### Industrial Community Research (IGF)

As a member of the Arbeitsgemeinschaft industrieller Forschungsvereinigungen "Otto von Guericke" e. V., DKG serves as the link for applying for federal funding. The focus is on application, material development, sustainability, testing and characterisation, simulation and modelling, and processing of rubber and other elastomers.

#### Own resources research

Currently, the DKG supports three universities with an annual lump sum of 13,500 euros each.

#### **Funding Scholarships**

Selected research with general relevance to the rubber industry is funded with a two-year scholarship.

#### Rubber Hall of Fame

We want to honour and showcase exceptional achievements in our industry. The DKG awards three different medals to individuals who have achieved outstanding results in research, technology, and application.
